## Arab federations discuss ways to address economic challenges

**Amman**  
The 57th session of specialized Arab federations, organized by the Arab League's Council of Arab Economic Unity (CAEU), kicked off in Amman on Sunday, aimed at regulating inter-Arab economic relations.

Addressing the opening session, Representative of the Senate President, Senator Issa Murad, said the meeting is "key" to address federations' challenges, regulate inter-Arab economic relations and discuss multiple development issues.

Murad said Arab world is witnessing political, security and economic challenges that have increased poverty and unemployment rates, triggered declining economic growth and high inflation, adding that Arab economic situation thus became "scary."

Continuing, "Several Arab countries today suffer from a scarcity of natural resources and an acute shortage of water resources," referring to increasing desertification areas, high levels of pollution, Covid-19

pandemic repercussions and effects of the Russian-Ukrainian war on the prices of food and energy commodities.

On future action, Murad stressed importance of reaching Arab economic integration to achieve sustainable development, harness Arab resources to strengthen food security, dodge repercussions of natural disasters, climate fluctuations, and political pressures due to "manipulating food as a weapon" by some countries.

For his part, CAEU

Secretary General, Ahmed Al Ni, said Jordan is "always keen" to enhance joint Arab action in various economic, social and political issues to achieve pan-Arab sustainable growth and realize prosperity.

Al Ni also noted CAEU sought to achieve its goals by implementing "feasible" plans, strategies and programs to meet Arab economic challenges, which would reflect "positively" on achieving the common Arab market to launch the desired Arab economic integration.

## Jordan's oil bill down in Q1 2023 by 0.4%-DoS



**Amman**

The Kingdom's oil bill dropped in the first quarter of 2023 by 0.4%, compared to the same period last year.

Value of the Kingdom's imports of crude oil, its derivatives and mineral oils went down in the first quarter of 2023, to reach JD758 million, compared to JD761 million in the same period last year, according to the monthly

report issued by the Department of Statistics (DoS) on Sunday.

Fuel and mineral oils topped the Kingdom's oil imports in the first four months of 2023, amounting to about JD250 million, followed by gasoline at about JD172 million, then crude oil at about JD162 million, diesel at about JD164 million, and lubricants at about JD10 million, the DoS figures showed.

## Jordan's total exports up 6pct in Q1 of 2023

**Amman**

Jordan's total exports went up by 6.3 percent in the first quarter of 2023 to a total of JD2.118 billion, compared with JD1.993 billion recorded in the same reporting period of 2022, according to official figures.

Monthly data issued by the Department of Statistics on Sunday showed that the Kingdom's national exports picked up by 8.8 percent reaching JD1.975 billion in the first quarter of 2023,

compared with JD1.815 billion recorded in the same reporting period of 2022. Meanwhile, the value of re-exports in the same period dropped by 19.1 percent to a total of JD144 million compared with JD178 million.

As for imports, the figures indicate that they amounted to JD4.514 billion in the first quarter of the current year, rising by 5.6 percent from the JD4.276 billion registered in the same period of last year.

According to these figures, foreign trade deficit rose by 4.9 percent to JD2.395 billion against JD2.283 billion recorded in the same period of last year.

On a monthly level, total exports, which include re-exports, hit JD655.2 million in the March of 2023, signaling a decline of 15.6 percent compared to the same month of last year.

Similarly, national exports dropped by 15.6

percent to reach JD603.3 million in March of the current year, while re-exports went down by 14.8 percent to a total of JD51.9 million.

Imports for the month of March of the current year, amounted to JD1.504 billion, constituting a 0.8-percent decline.

Foreign trade deficit rose by 14.7 percent to JD848.7 million in March 2023 compared to the figure recorded in the same month of last year.

## Bookagri enables tourists to immerse in Jordanian agricultural experience

**Amman**

An agritourism experiences and destinations development company has granted tourists the chance to indulge in an agricultural experience in several Jordanian rural areas.

Bookagri.com has partnered with local farmers to allow tourists to participate in hands-on activities like milking goats, beekeeping, and traditional baking, said Founder and CEO of Bookagri Rudaina Haddad during a lecture hosted by the Jordan Society for Scientific Research, Entrepreneurship, and Creativity on Sunday.

She added that tourists can choose from agritourism destinations in Salt, Jerash, Ajloun, and Karak and spend the day with farmers or even

stay overnight in the Bookagri's accommodation.

Furthermore, the project offers visitors tours, cooking lessons, home product development, and an interactive platform, according to Haddad.

She stated that agricultural tourism in Jordan has seen a significant increase in popularity, with numerous visitors coming to experience producing agricultural and animal products and acquire manual farming skills.

Stressing Bookagri's economic benefit for local communities, Haddad said women can generate cost-free income from their farms' resources as well as interact with foreigners.

## SEXUAL, REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH AND RIGHTS CONFERENCE OPENS

**Amman**

A two-day conference, "Networking and Learning... We Lead to Establish Reproductive and Sexual Health Rights," kicked off on Sunday in Amman, drawing participants from the Ministry of Health, government institutions, and a host of civil society organizations.

This conference is a component of the "We Lead" project, a dynamic five-year initiative inaugurated by Hivos and five coalition partners in 2021. This initiative, funded by the Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs, is aimed squarely at empowering, advocating for, and amplifying the voices and experiences of young women who are disproportionately affected by neglect in the sphere of reproductive health.

Fattouh Younes, the Executive Director of Arab Network for Civic Education - ANHRE, during her opening remarks at the conference, noted that the event provided a golden opportunity for the civil society to synergize their efforts in ensuring women can fully and effectively exercise their sexual and reproductive health rights.

A significant stride in



promoting the sexual rights and reproductive health of women and girls was the adoption of the Family Protection Law, which set the groundwork for an enabling legislative environment.

Furthermore, the implementation of the National Strategy for Women in Jordan for 2020-2025, along with the Action Plan and ratification of the National Strategy for Sexual Rights and Reproductive Health for 2020-2030, underscores the

government's unwavering commitment to these issues.

In her address, Hadeel Saeh, the Director of the Directorate of Women and Children's Health at the Ministry of Health, underscored the challenges that vulnerable demographic cohorts encounter in accessing services within a cultural context that remains sensitive to discussing sexual and reproductive health issues. This sensitivity fosters persistent obstacles to requesting and accessing

services and information.

Sarah Salih, Hivos Regional Director, emphasized the organization's commitment to gender equality and fostering an inclusive community that supports marginalized groups, particularly women and girls. The goal is to boost cooperation and engagement, bolster local ownership, and conceive participatory programs that amplify their voices.

Nyambura Gathumbi,

Global Program Manager at "We Lead", pointed out that the program is being executed across nine countries spanning Africa, the Middle East, and Central America. The "We Lead" consortium comprises six partners and a technical partner, including Hivos, Positive Vibes, FCAM, Marsa, FEMNET, and M&C Saatchi World Services.

The five-year program is being financed by the Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs under the auspices

of the Partnership Fund for Sexual and Reproductive Health, forming part of the Civil Society Strengthening Support Framework.

Meanwhile, Muhannad Azza, the Secretary-General of the Supreme Council for the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, emphasized the critical importance of families and individuals recognizing the significance of sexual education as a bulwark against sexual harassment for both males and females.

He drew a distinction between sexual exploitation or harassment and courtship while reiterating that reproductive and sexual health isn't a luxury but a fundamental necessity.

The opening day's sessions concentrated on empowering women and girls to make informed and prudent decisions related to their sexual and reproductive lives.

The participants exchanged insights, best practices, tools, and strategies with the aim of bolstering actionable recommendations, promoting inclusive policies and mechanisms, and building enduring partnerships with the government.

In addition, a Royal Decree was issued naming Mohammad Musleh Abu Anza as a member of the Constitutional Court, as of May 28, 2023.

## Instructions to regulate university students' partisan activities approved

**Amman** Council of Higher Education (CHE) approved instructions to regulate student partisan activities in Jordan's higher education institutions, in its session held on May 4, Minister of Higher Education and Scientific Research, Dr. Azmi Mahafazah, announced on Sunday.

The minister added that CHE issued instructions in accordance with provisions of Articles (8) and (11) of the bylaw regulating student partisan activities. In a statement, Mahafazah noted the instructions were submitted to the Council of Ministers for approval and publication in the Official Gazette.

## 10 Jordanian companies took part in PLMA 2023 in Amsterdam

**Amman** 10 Jordanian companies specialized in foodstuffs, packaging and household needs took part in PLMA 2023 fair, which was recently held in the Dutch capital, Amsterdam.

According to a statement issued Sunday, by Jordan Exports, which organized Jordan's participation, said presence aimed to increase volume of Jordanian exports and

open new markets.

The fair, which saw participation of 1,200 companies from 90 countries, is viewed as a top international event specialized in private labels industry sector in foodstuffs, detergents and consumer chemicals, and represents an opportunity to market and export Jordanian products to European Union countries, the statement said.

## AUM president, Japanese envoy talk academic cooperation

**Madaba** The American University of Madaba (AUM) on Sunday hosted the Japanese Ambassador to Jordan, Okayama Jiro, in a seminar aimed at highlighting the bilateral relations and reviewing opportunities to the university's faculty members and students, especially in Japan.

According to an AUM statement, the university's president, Mamoun Akroush, stressed keenness to enhance cultural and academic exchange with Japan's educational and academic institutions, as part of efforts to provide education aimed to raise students' academic level and enhance their basic skills.

## Water ministry, GIZ inaugurate sector governance project

**Amman** The Ministry of Water and Irrigation, in cooperation with the German Agency for International Cooperation (GIZ), on Sunday, organized a workshop on Water Sector Governance Project, aimed to improving performance and addressing the sector's various challenges.

Addressing the event, the ministry's Secretary-General, Jihad Mahamid, said Jordan suffers from water scarcity which "is much less than the international water poverty line."

Mahamid added that the pressure is increasing

on the Kingdom's available water resources, due to the population increase, the large number of Syrian refugees and effects of climate change, which contributed to declining water resources, triggered by increasing use and depleting groundwater resources that led to a "clear decline in the per capita share."

For his part, Acting Secretary-General of Water Authority of Jordan (WAJ), Rami Abu Rawaq, said the authority is looking forward to benefiting from expertise and modern technologies in all water sector institutions, to achieve the goals and

aspirations of the sector's strategic plans, achieve sustainable development, build capabilities, and extend technical support, and realize "effective" institutional development of services provided to reach "advanced" levels to reduce the citizens' burdens and improve supply efficiency in all regions.

Meanwhile, Director of GIZ Water Projects, Trevor Surig, said the project will support, during the next four years, the long-term planning of Jordan's water sector institutions in addressing multiple issues, primarily resource availability, demand fluctuations and optimal

resource allocation. Surig added that the project also to supporting water sector institutions in implementing good governance principles.

On the project's main objectives, he said its activities seek to improve dialogue among water sector institutions, support their performance monitoring, strengthen human resource management, and improve central water management.

The project, he noted, focuses on digitization and data security issue and efforts to expand this drive nationally to improve services level to spare reduce time and effort.

first in many years, as the Jordanians are awaiting the marriage of Prince Al Hussein bin Abdullah II to Ms Rajwa Khaled Al Saif, on June 1.

## Jordan ranks 8th globally in int'l tourism receipts growth

**AMMAN**

The Kingdom ranked eighth globally in terms of international tourism receipts growth during the first quarter (Q1) of 2023, according to the United Nations World Tourism Organisation (UNWTO).

The most recent UNWTO World Tourism Barometer, which regularly monitors global tourism trends, showed that Jordan's international tourism receipts witnessed a 31 per cent growth during the first three months of 2023 compared with Q1 of 2019.

Jordan was preceded by Mauritius, Portugal, Morocco, Turkey, Serbia, Romania and Pakistan which marked a 208 per cent growth, according to the report.

Its data also shows that the destinations reporting the highest growth in international tourist arrivals in Q1 of 2023 compared with Q1 of 2019 are Qatar with a 98 per cent growth, followed by Saudi Arabia with a 64 per cent growth and Albania with a 54 per cent growth.

"International tourism is well on its way to returning to pre-pandemic levels, with twice as many people travelling during the first quarter of 2023 than in the same period of 2022,



UNWTO said in a recent statement.

Its report stated that international tourist arrivals reached 80 per cent of pre-pandemic levels in Q1 of 2023. During this period, roughly 235 million tourists travelled internationally, which is more than twice the number of tourists recorded in Q1 of 2022, it noted.

"The Middle East saw the strongest performance as the only region exceeding 2019 arrivals +15% and the first to recover pre-pandemic numbers in a full quarter," the report said.

Europe recovered 90 per cent of pre-pandemic tourist arrivals, while Africa reached 88 per cent, the Americas recovered about 85 per cent of 2019 levels and Asia and the Pacific recovered 54 of tourist arrivals' pre-pandemic levels, it added.

The report predicts a continued recovery in international tourism during 2023 "backed by strong pent-up demand, the sustained recovery of air connectivity, as well as by the recent reopening of China and other major Asian markets and destinations".

However, the UNWTO Panel of Experts survey indicates that "the challenging economic environment continues to be the main factor weighing on the effective recovery of international tourism in 2023, with high inflation and rising oil prices translating into higher transport and accommodations costs", according to the report.

Associate Professor of Tourism Marketing and Assistant Dean at the School of Tourism and Hospitality at Yarmouk University,

Salem Harahsheh noted that Jordan enjoys a diverse range of geographical features and a high level of safety and security, which distinguish it as a "favourite" tourist attraction.

"The Kingdom offers diverse tourism products that allow it to target and attract different types of tourists from different markets around the world," he told The Jordan Times.

The includes historical and archaeological sites such as Petra and religiously significant sites such the Baptism Site of Jesus Christ, Harahsheh noted.

Visitors can also enjoy medical tourism experiences in the Ma'in Hot Springs and the Dead Sea and visit natural reserves in different regions across the Kingdom, he added.

## Injaz, Aflatoun launch project-management program for youth



**Amman** Youth-centered non-profit organizations Injaz and Aflatoun International, with support from the American Project Management (APM), have developed a program aimed at educating young people on key project management concepts and terminology.

The 3-year program seeks to assist young individuals in constructing a comprehensive project management system by introducing them to scientific methods for project implementation. The program intends to reach 13,000 students in different schools

across the Kingdom, said an Injaz statement on Sunday.

The program also outlines project requirements, including managing time, finances, and potential risks, as well as prioritizing tasks, identifying available resources for construction, working collaboratively as a team, and possessing problem-solving skills for any issues that may arise during implementation.

In addition, the program incorporates hands-on project management activities to promote positive interaction among participants and equip them with valuable life skills.
